

**Arnprior Aerospace Inc. (AAI) Statement on Conflict Minerals:**

Arnprior Aerospace Inc. supports our customers due diligence/ conformance with the conflict minerals requirements of the Dodd-Frank Act.

As a supplier to customers publicly traded in the United States of America, AAI will take appropriate measures to comply with the requirements of Section 1502 of the Dodd-Frank Wall Street Reform and Consumer Protection Act and the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC) rules and regulations, by performing due diligence on, and making disclosures concerning, its use of conflict minerals originating in the Democratic Republic of Congo and adjoining countries.

AAI requires all its vendors to similarly comply with these requirements and submit their annual declaration in the prescribed format. Vendors shall respond to information requests from Arnprior Aerospace Inc. regarding the uses and sources of conflict minerals 3TG (tin, tungsten, tantalum and gold) in their goods including information about minerals that are recycled or scrap.

AAI is committed to responsible sourcing of conflict minerals. AAI strongly encourages its supply chain to develop a policy which addresses conflict minerals sourcing, and requires its supply chain to

- (i) Be DRC conflict-free as defined in the SEC conflict minerals final rule
- (ii) Source from smelters validated by an independent private sector audit firm
- (iii) Provide AAI with its smelter names.
